
### **Communication with Parents and Whanau**



## **Learning in the Middle School**

We have been doing some exciting writing in the Middle School, with three of our classes taking part in the Get NZ Writing Project which involved us doing some amazing Ko au (I am) poetry as a class, then individually. This was a fabulous link to our theme of Identity this term. In Room 9 (Summer) we were super proud of our class poem so we thought we would share it with you.





Once we finished our Ko Au poem, we chose our favourite line and published it on the back of a postcard. We also completed a poster with all sorts of interesting information about ourselves and sent it off. We received our postcards in the mail and we loved reading them and putting each piece together to make the puzzle on the right. Room 5 and Room 6 are almost finished theirs and will be receiving their exciting package in the mail in the next few days.

Another interesting activity we have all been working on is Me and My World - exploring all the things that are important to us in different parts of our lives. These will be on display in classes very soon and parents are welcome to come into classes to see these wonderful pieces of work.

Room 5 have been experimenting with chromatography. With felts, we drew circles onto coffee filter paper and dipped them in water. This separated the pigments that make up each colour. For example, the purple

separated into pink and blue. Check out the results of this experiment!
