A massive thank you to the PTA for organising our first school fundraiser for 2018, and a special thank you to all those children and families who contributed to this fundraiser by selling pies.



In Room 11 we have been practicing our writing in different ways. A couple of our favourites are writing in shaving foam and making letters and numbers with play dough. So much fun.








Room 10 Buzzing Bees
