Dear Parents and Whanau,

On Wednesday the 29th of May Pekerau School will be closed while teachers go on strike.

WHAT WE ARE CAMPAIGNING FOR?

* More teachers – so your kids can get more attention * More resources/staff to support children with additional learning and behaviour needs * A pay jolt to salaries for teachers to address the teacher shortage – so that your children will have a teacher in the future.

As educators our Pekerau Teachers continue to be frustrated and saddened by the spin in the media and from Education Minister Chris Hipkins down playing our requests for pay parity.

- •It costs \$6,120 per year to complete a 3 year Bachelor of Teaching at The University of Waikato which allows you to teach at a Primary OR Secondary Level.
- •Upon graduation, secondary teachers are paid at a higher salary than primary teachers.
- Primary teachers get 10 hours a term release time. Secondary teachers get 5 hours a week.
- •When our collective agreement expired in 2018, the government offered primary teachers a \$500 bonus to sign the new agreement. They offered secondary teachers \$1000.
- •Minister Chris Hipkins has been reported as saying that the latest offer (that teachers have rejected) would increase teacher salaries by \$10,000, putting teachers in the in the top 20% of salary earners in New Zealand. University graduate teachers start on \$47,980 a year. The rejected offer gives them 3% straight away which equates to about \$19 a week after tax for a new teacher or \$27 a week for an experienced teacher.
- •Teacher salaries are capped. After 7 years a teacher will reach the top of their pay grade.
- •There has been a 40% reduction in people wanting to study to become teachers.
- Record numbers of teachers are leaving the profession. 30% of Principals leave the profession within 5 years.
- •A decade ago, a teaching vacancy could easily attract over 100 applicants and Principals could choose the best candidates to meet the needs of their school. Now our NZ schools are struggling to fill vacancies with NZ trained teachers.
- Many teachers come to work when they are sick because it is so difficult to get relievers.
- •Many referrals for behaviour and learning needs are turned down or have waiting lists of at least 6 months before children and teachers can access the urgent help they need.
- •The Government has a bumper surplus of \$5.5 billion, more than enough to fix the issues in primary education (\$0.9b).

We appreciate your ongoing support while we advocate for better conditions for our students and for our teachers. Our students are worth it and so are we!









PEKERAU SCHOOL WILL BE CLOSED ON WEDNESDAY 29th MAY 2019. THERE WON'T BE ANY TEACHERS AT SCHOOL TO LOOK AFTER STUDENTS.

Dear Parents, Whanau and Caregivers,

The NZEI has advised the Pekerau School Board of Trustees that the Teachers at our school will be taking strike action on Monday 29th of May for a full teaching day.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services during the strike. It's important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike. **The school will need to close during the strike.**

The Pekerau Board of Trustees believe that teachers and support staff in all schools need support to make sure their claim is heard and validated by the current Minister of Education. Whilst we apologise for the inconvenience of having to arrange alternative child care for the day we hope that you will join us in supporting our valuable and hard working staff.


