guide to Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences

What are Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences?

 These are learning based discussions with the student, their whanau and the teacher.



- At conference the student and teacher will talk about what the student has been learning how to do at school, what levels the student is achieving at and what their next steps are.
- The teacher will talk to you about the written report you received and you can ask questions about that report.
- Whanau can ask questions and share important information about your child and the way they learn. Sometimes the student will be able to answer questions and sometimes the teacher will.
- Conferences will take place in your child's classroom, they will be able to show you where that is when you both come in for your appointment.
- Each appointment is 10 minutes long. It's important for you to arrive on time and not to go beyond your time slot. If you need more time to talk with the teacher they will organise another time that suits you both.
- If you want to discuss something sensitive about the child, it is ok to ask them to step out of the interview for a few minutes or you can make a time to talk to the teacher separately.

Questions you could ask your child and the teacher at the conference.

- What does my child do well?
- Are there any areas of concern?
- How well is my child doing compared to other children the same age in NZ?
- What will you do if my child is struggling in class?
- What can I do to help you at home?
- Are there apps or online games available that will support my child's learning at home?
- Does my child seem settled at school? How well do they get along with others?
- What do you need to know about my child to help them in the classroom?
- What is the best way to contact you about how my child is doing? (Absences should be reported to the office).
