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




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Kia Ora Koutou,

Passion projects kicked off this week for the Tuakana Team. The children voted on what they wanted to participate in and the teachers have planned accordingly. This term the children have opted into a range of classes including Enviro activities with Whaea Riss, Ripper Rugby with Paul Wheeler (from the TA Rugby Club), Presenting with Mrs Mitchell, Art with Miss Muller, Science with Mrs B and hip hop dance with Matua Zac. The teachers are looking forward to offering these extra opportunities to the children.

Next Friday we are packing our teachers up and heading to Te Akau ki Papamoa (School) where we'll be observing their classroom teachers and checking out their Maori curriculum: looking into how they developed this within their English medium school. When Principal Bruce Jepsen joined Te Akau ki Pāpāmoa School in 2007, the roll was plummeting, 90% of the students at the school were failing, and could not read, write or do maths. 12 years on, the school is now one of the most successful primary schools in the country, and digital technology plays a big part in that success. We are going to fill our own teaching kete with pearls of knowledge as we continue to write our own story of success for the students, whanau and community of Pekerau School.

Getting to School on the Bus

Behaviour and Safety on the bus

- All of the Te Awamutu Schools in conjunction with GO BUS agree that each school will be responsible for the behaviour of their own students on the bus.
- At Pekerau, we ask you to sign a bus agreement and explain the behaviour expectations to your child.
- Consistently poor behaviour could result in your child not being allowed to travel on the bus.

Eligibility and Bus Tags

To be eligible for transport assistance your child must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The school must be the closest state or state integrated school your child can enrol at
- 2. Your child must live At least 3.2 km from the school (over the shortest public road or pedestrian route from home roadside gate to the school's front gate).
- 3. There must be no suitable public transport

There is a \$35 charge for bus tags for non-eligible students that can be paid to the office. We are not allowed to let your child travel on the bus without a tag (even if it is for a short period)

Lastly, we were recently given a heads up that GO BUS are likely to increase the cost of bus tags in the future. There was no date or price indicated but it could be as much as \$50 per student.

PHOTO LIFE CLASS and INDIVIDUAL PHOTOS


Your son or daughter will bring home an online slip with their unique Access Key detailed on it. This Access Key will display all the photographs of your child.


